The proposed amendment also will allow bicycle trails and certain public utility lines to be located within the width of specified highways that cross the forest preserve while minimizing removal of trees and vegetation. #### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Mark in pen or pencil.
2. To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot, fill in the  to the right of the candidate's name, like: ■
3. To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot, write or stamp his or her name in the space that appears at the bottom of the column containing the title of the office.
4. To vote on a proposal fill in the  in one of the squares contained in the box setting forth such proposal, like: ■
5. Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting squares or blank spaces provided for voting will void this entire ballot.
6. Do not overvote. If you select a greater number of candidates than there are vacancies to be filled, your ballot will be void for that public office, party position or proposal.

7. If you tear, or deface, or wrongly mark this ballot, call the Board of Elections at (315) 539-1760 for instructions on how to obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross outs. Erasures or cross outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon return of the original ballot.
8. To be counted, absentee ballots returned by mail must be postmarked no later than the day before election day and be received by the Board of Elections no later than 7 days after election day.

#### HOW TO RETURN ABSENTEE BALLOT

1. After marking the ballot, fold such ballot and enclose it in the envelope bearing the voter's statement, and seal the envelope.
2. Fill in properly the blanks in the Statement and sign your name.
3. Enclose the sealed envelope bearing the Statement in the envelope addressed to the Board of Elections and mail promptly.
